Behind the Scenes, Proactive and Reactive

Advocacy & Government Relations

Cultivating relationships with elected officials - including city, state, and federal representatives - is a key pillar of our work. We advocate for policies and positions consistent with our organization's positions and Jewish values.

Interfaith and Intergroup

Building bridges among various faith communities and constituency groups fosters greater understanding and coalitions ready to support each other in times of joy and challenge.

K-12 and Universities

Supporting students, parents, teachers, and administrators through our PREP programs keeps Jewish students safe at school. Our student empowerment programs, including Leaders for Tomorrow, teach students to become stronger advocates for themselves and the Jewish people. We continue to provide case management and support when incidents do occur.

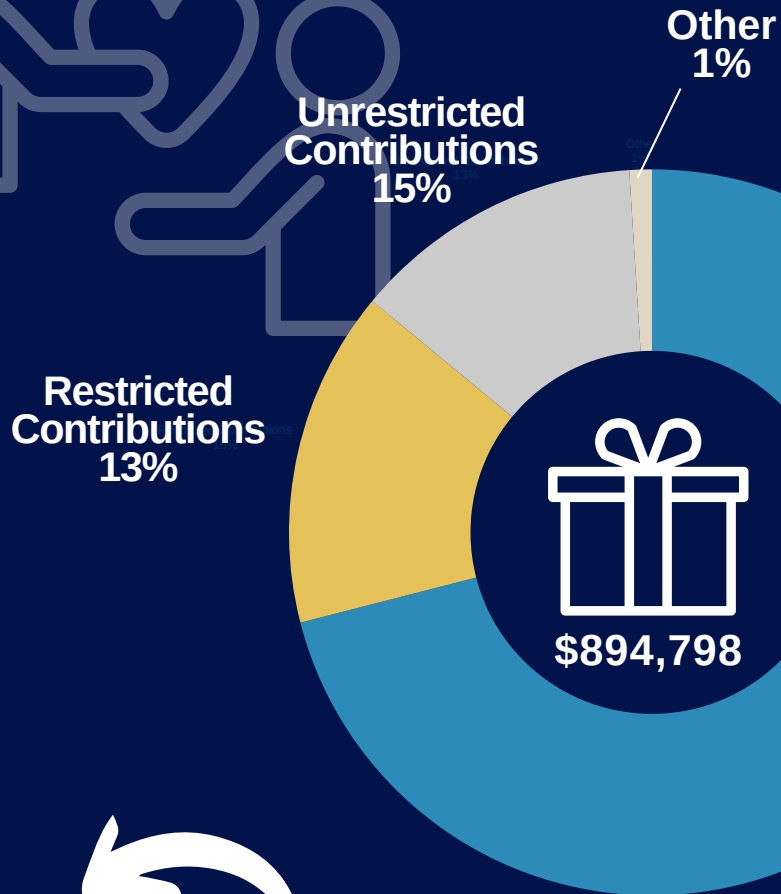

SUPPORT JCRB|AJC



JCRB|AJC continues to grow its **Community Relations** efforts, including ongoing support for the Strangers No More program, engagement with interfaith clergy, and participation in events such as the annual MLK Interfaith Service. This year, the organization distributed Jewish holiday calendars to over 4,000 partners, including 44 local schools and school districts.

JCRB|AJC **Educational and Advocacy Programs** experienced strong participation throughout the year. Highlights included A Year Without: October 7 Memorial, the Intro to Advocacy workshop for KC's ACCESS chapter, and Driving Out Darkness in the Heartland: 2024 Regional Summit on Combating Antisemitism. Our educational outreach expanded significantly, establishing new partnerships with both K–12 schools and universities across the region.

Our Making Space program continues to provide impactful training for companies and organizations seeking to foster Jewish inclusion and cultural competency among employees.

In **Government Relations**, JCRB|AJC marked Jewish American Heritage Month with targeted outreach and advocacy. We also deepened relationships with congressional offices and built meaningful connections with local, state, and federal officials to advance our mission.
